

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# ASIAN MODERN FINE ART AND COLLECTIBLES AUCTION

#### **Auction Notification**

SIDHartA Auctioneer is an official auction that is monitored by the Office of Auctions of the Direktorat Jendral Kekayaan Negara Indonesia . An Auction Registrar, Jimmy Novianto Suryadi is present on behalf of the Office of Auctions to monitor that the auction is run properly, provide an official report to the government and ensure that the winning bidders comply with their part, ie make payment in full and in due time.

This auction is a regular Continental Style auction. Bidders bid the lots they desire until the highest bid is reached. There is a 22% buyer's premium charged on top of hammer price that is to be paid by the winning bidder in addition to the hammer price itself.

You will find the lots to be auctioned in sequence, starting from the lowest number to the highest number. Live online auction usually goes at a rate of 50 lots perhour. 108 lots should take around 2 hour, 10 minutes

The estimate price of the lot reflects roughly the current price of the artworks, meaning in normal circumstances, a bidder placing a bid within the range of the estimate should be able to win the lot, unless there is unusual competition. However, depending on demand, a bidder may also be able to win the lot at a price either lower than the low estimate (at the reserve price), or even win the piece at a price higher than the high estimate.

Most of the lots do have a reserve, a minimum limit price at which the owner/vendor of the lot agrees to let go of the lot. Auctioneer is allowed to execute bidding up to the reserve, on behalf of the owner/vendor of the lot. That is what is going on when bidding has started, and the Auctioneer counters the bid by saying that a bid of a certain lot is still "with me". Until bidding reaches the reserve, a lot cannot be considered sold. So a lot is only considered sold if it has already reached the reserve.

Bidding does not stop only until the reserve is reached, but it continues until the highest bid has been reached and the auctioneer will count up to three to make sure that there are no more bids. The Auctioneer will strike the hammer strike is to signify that the lot has been sold and call out the paddle number of the bidder and the hammer price.

We commonly have Written Bids, Phone Bids and Online Bids. Our operators on the phone will execute bids on behalf of the phone bidders who are monitoring the auction via the phone. Absentee Written Bids have also been placed with the Auctioneer and they have been registered in the auction book. Online Bids are executed automatically via the internet.

The Auctioneer will execute the Absentee Bids up to the limit that they have provided, and you will also hear that the absentee bid is "with me", and the Auctioneer will indicate that the bid is a Written Bid that is left by an Absentee bidder. So, bidders on the floor will be also competing with Absentee Bidders who have left their bids with us, phone bidders, and online bidders.

The lot in the auctions are sold as is and condition reports of each lot is available upon request. You should have consulted the works that you want to buy. If there are certain mistakes in the wording of the information of the lots in the catalog, we will put them up in Sale Room Notices.

Certificates: We are not authorized, do not and will not publish certificates. So unless there is mention of certificates in the auction catalog, please do not expect to obtain any certificates from us.

Our office operates from Tuesday to Saturday; therefore, you should receive the invoice inclusive the 22% premium by today or at the latest on Tuesday or Wednesday.

We accept bank transfer and credit card payment, and it is expected to be completed in three days. You may pick up the lots by showing necessary proofs of payment or it can also be delivered at a reasonable extra cost.





# Salím, Our Artíst in París, at Our Auction in Jakarta

Lot# 504 & 505

Until he passed away in Paris over a decade ago at the age of 100, the Indonesian artist Salim has lived there since 1957, and also for a few years in the 1920s. Since he moved to Europe in 1912, he only visited Indonesia five or six times. In the Indonesian art world, he was known as "our man in Paris".

While it is said that nobody knows where Salim came from, an article in the Merdeka weekly mentions that he emerged in Holland as a young foster child of a former planter from Deli, East Sumatra. Even to his closest friends he never revealed who he really was. An article published in the Konfrontasi periodical in 1956 mentions that he was born in Medan, North Sumatra on 3 September 1908.

After completing his high school studies at Arnhem, he left his foster parents to pursue his interest in art. In particular, he was a believer of "l'art pour l'art" (art for art's sake), and therefore he was bound for Paris. When he arrived in Paris with very little money, he was faced with the reality that becoming an artist was not as easy as he imagined. Therefore he had to accept a job as a doorman at the Académie de La Grande Chaumière, an art academy. Due to his handsome appearance, the owner of the academy, apparently a French aristocratic lady, eventually allowed him to study there. Not only did he not have to guard the entrance and do the chores of a porter anymore but he also became one of the favorite students of the owner of the academy. The following year, 1929, he attended Académie Léger, an academy that Fernand Léger set up with his colleagues, where art students could study art, free of charge.

After his adventures in Paris he returned to Amsterdam and became acquainted with Indonesian students who studied there, among others Mohammad Hatta and Sutan Sjahrir. They discussed matters about art, culture, and society. This sparked his interests towards his home country. He intended to visit the Netherlands Indies, where he hoped to propagate his ideals of "l'art pour l'art".

In the early 1930s Siahrir's brother-in-law. Dioehana Wiradikarta, obtained his medical degree in Holland and was returning home with his family. By working as the caretaker of Djoehana's children during the month-long journey, Salim was able to join them to the Indies. In Batavia, he worked at an advertising company called the Java Neon Company. He also assisted Sjahrir and Hatta both at their PNI-Pendidikan party and the Daulat Ra'jat magazine. The two prominent politicians were eventually exiled to Boven Digoel, and this left Salim to introspect. Throughout his stay in the Indies, he faced the grim reality that it was under colonial rule. Whereas in Europe he lived as an equal to others, in his own home country he was subject to the colonial social structure that was based on racial classification. He faced discrimination and subordination, something that he had not experienced before. Therefore he decided to return to Europe. "I prefer to die hungry in the artistic center of the world, rather than to live full of abundance in a colonized land, feeling depressed," he is guoted to have said in the periodical Konfrontasi in 1956, reminiscing his experiences in the Indies in the 1930s.

He started exhibiting in Holland, initially in a joint exhibition at the Santee Landweer gallery in 1936, and then at Helen Spooi Gallery in 1939. After World War II, disappointed with the Netherlands' return to claim Indonesia as its colony, the artist moved to Sète, a town in France. He held his first solo exhibition there in 1948. In October the following year, Salim held a solo exhibition at the M. L. de Boer Gallery, opened by noted Dutch artist Charles Roelofsz. The show was attended by the Indonesian delegation who came to Holland for the Round Table Conference held in The Hague that year, which led to the Dutch recognition of Dutch sovereignty.

In this exhibition, Salim received praise from Dutch critics. "It is clear that in a part of his works exhibited, Salim underwent the influence of Raoul Dufy, the French painter, illustrator, designer of gobelins and printed fabrics and ceramicist. His strong colors radiate joy, healthy optimism," writes one critic. "This artist from 'the belt of the emerald around the equator' has the view of a European painter. There is nothing in this work that reminds us of the land of his birth, or it must be the fierce flare of the sun, all of which glow. The park in Montpellier reminds us of Cezanne, although this in no way means that Salim would be a slave follower of the European master. On the contrary, he has a personal perspective on what inspires him to paint, while the sun's glow from his native country appears to accompany him on his many wanderings through Europe and thereby lends his art a special charm," writes another.

Salim decided to visit his home country, now a new republic, once again. In Indonesia, his solo exhibition was first held in 1951 with the support of the Foundation for Cultural Cooperation, featuring paintings all done in France. The show was opened by Sjahrir, who mentioned that had known him for a long time. He said that during that time, while he himself was still unsure about his purpose in life, Salim had already known that his life would be a balance of beauty, justness, and honesty, and that is what we can see through his works in the exhibition. Critic Trisno Sumardjo was also fair in his review of the exhibition. He said that we have to look at Salim's art in context. It would not be appropriate to expect to see Eastern, nationalist nor proletariat values in his works. Instead, if we view them using universal values, we can see that the world he reveals is beautiful, as he is an artist without prejudice nor pretense, a true modernist.

In 1956 Salim exhibited at the Balai Budaya, presenting works he made during his four-month stay in Indonesia. In the Konfrontasi periodical, artist Baharudin Marasutan wrote that he hoped that Salim's visit to Indonesia would be useful towards his further artistic development in Europe. From 1957 until his death in 2008, Salim lived in an apartment in the city of Neuilly-sur-Seine near Paris. How much his experience in Indonesia contributed to his progress as an artist might need further study, but he did become quite a successful artist, exhibiting in Europe every few years in the 1950s to the 1970s. In the 1970s he won prizes and medals from art festivals in which he participated. He returned to Indonesia to exhibit his works in Jakarta and Bandung in 1974 and 1990. Later he exhibited in Bali in 2001 and Osaka in 2002. As Salim has lived in Europe for most of his life, he is still considered an Indonesian artist, but as he has lived for over 60 years in Paris, he will always be considered as "our man in Paris".

Now, we have a good opportunity to auction two of the remaining works available by "our artist in Paris", the late Salim. The two paintings are works done towards the end of his life, yet still very much shows his mastery of his profession as a painter. The painting Abstract shows a non-representational composition of the artist's imagination or his state of mind. Meanwhile, although the painting Flowers in a Vase clearly is a representation, it might not be of actual flowers in a vase. It might be a painting of imaginary flowers in an imaginary vase. The artist is free to depict what he wishes and create his art for art's sake. We hope that this brief introduction to Salim and his works will be appreciated by our art enthusiasts here in Jakarta.





# The Masks by Nasirun

Lot #517

In this piece, Nasirun depicts an eclectic cast of characters from Javanese theatre, specifically Cirebon. The Cirebon Mask is a very poetic depiction of the presence of the universe and humanity. Sang Hyang Tunggal, which is an absolute singleness without distinction, turns into a relative diversity that is very different in nature. Cirebon masks, which were originally centered in palaces, are now spread among rural farming communities. And like most folk arts, Cirebon Masks are also rapidly undergoing transformations. 

A still life painting of fruit by the impressionist maestro Cezanne may have more beauty than a pile of fruit. This third beauty is very personal and sometimes egoistic. However, the value of beauty cannot be measured by reasonable values.

#### Kampung Di Tepi Sungai? By Mas Pirngadie

This painting shows how people in some parts of Jakarta (or Batavia as it was known at the time, lived at the turn of the 20th century. Chinese shophouses were built on the banks of canals. Therefore the shophouses had two "fronts", one facing the road, while the other, as can be seen in this painting, facing the canal. People could enter from both sides, as well. Remnants of these houses can be found around the Pekojan area of Oldtown Jakarta today.

Mas Pirngadie is known as a mentor of S. Sudjojono, the foremost pioneer of Modern Indonesian art. "Why, you render the schoool yard as if you are plowing the soil," commented Pirngadie on Sudjojono's painting of the Arjuna School. The teacher thought that the way the young boy painted was too coarse. But as we can se in this painting, it is also executed quite coarsely. Could Pirngadie have perhaps learnt something about painting from his pupil, Sudjojono?





# Still Life By Soedibio

Lot #559

Soedibio is known primarily because of his paintings which are Decorativist in style. The term Decorativist refers to the use repetitive motives of decoration that are applied toseveral traditional elements in Indonesian art and culture,

In the 1950s, Indonesian art entered a debate in which Yogyakarta artists criticized Bandung artists whom theyconsidered too Western oriented. Bandung artists tended to follow Analytical Cubism, which they learnt from Ries Mulder, a Dutch professor who propagated this Western approach. Yogyakarta artists advocated approaches which were more Indonesian in character, such as realism, including social realism, which was akin to revolutionary Indonesian ideas and thoughts, and Decorativism, which embraced traditional motifs. The debate continues on until today although not in the same intensity. However it became the stylistic identity of the two regions.

In this painting the artist combines his signature Decorativist approach with an approach which is akin to analytical cubism. While he is not the only artist to have combined the Yogyakarta and Bandung approaches. Soedibio seems to have mastered this rare artistic feat.






# At The Beach By Popo Iskandar


